NAVIGATING SOCIAL SECURITY DISABILITY INSURANCE (SSDI)

We've broken down the tricky parts of Social Security Disability Insurance - here's what you need to know.



What is SSDI?

<u>SSDI</u> is a government benefit that provides monthly payments to Americans living with disabilities who are no longer working.



About 8.5 million Americans draw benefits from SSDI per year -- you are not alone!

Will I Qualify?

Were you working and reporting a salary within the last 10 years?

- OR -

Did you work and report a salary the year before your diagnosis?

Great! You're On Your Way to Qualifying. Here's How it Works:

Qualification works on a <u>credit system</u>. If you or a loved one had a job covered by Social Security before your disability, you were earning credits toward this benefit through your salary. It's like a shopper's rewards card: the longer you worked, the more credits you earned!



Qualification is based on credits you've earned. Check out this helful chart:

If your disability began at age:	You will generally need \checkmark to qualify:
31-42	5 Years of Work, Or Less 20 Credits
44	5.5 Years of Work 22 Credits
46	6 Years of Work 24 Credits
48	6.5 Years of Work 26 Credits
50	7 Years of Work 28 Credits
52	• • • • • • • • • • = Solution 7.5 Years of Work 30 Credits
54	8 Years of Work 32 Credits
56	8.5 Years of Work
58	9 Years of Work 36 Credits
60	9.5 Years of Work
62 & Older	10 Years of Work

** If you recevied a diagnosis before the age of 21 or through the age of 31, you can STILL <u>gualify</u>! Fewer credits are needed to receive benefits, ranging from 6 - 20.

How Do I Access Benefits?



Apply in person at your local Social Security office.

How Will This Impact My Finances?

Great question! You can expect an average of the salary you or your disabled loved one earned over total working years to determine the value of each monthly payment.
